Dear friends

Greetings of peace from Ústí nad Labem.

Dear praying brethren, thank you for your prayers and fellowship in the Holy Spirit. I value dearly your sacrificial and committed ministry on our behalf. Thanks to God's grace, we can experience God's response to your prayers. That is such a huge support and encouragement to us.

At the end of April, people from Roudnice, Kladno and Ústí church distributed leaflets at an important event near Roudnice. By God's grace, we gave out nearly 9,000 gospel tracts. We pray this sowing brings huge benefit and namely salvation to people who received them.

Last Sunday in May we worshiped God together with Roudnice and Kladno churches. It was an encouraging and joyous meeting. We are always glad when we can spend time with other believers who share our attitude to God's Word.

During Easter, we got under a degree of pressure due to the local ecumenical movement. We refused to co-operate at a public reading of the Bible in which other churches from Ústí took part, including Roman Catholics, liberals and adventists. As our city is not that large and there aren't many believers, our stance created a tension in relationships and brought about malicious gossip. Please pray for us, and especially for our church members so that they can bear these troubles well. Some people who come to our meeting are from other churches or have friends there and they sometimes find it hard to explain our position. It usually means they have to bear words saying we are a sect, or that we don't have the love of Christ, or that we do not care about the matters of God's kingdom. However, quite the opposite is true – we want to be faithful to God's Word and God's calling to holiness, purity and separated lives.

The English Camp in Kamenický Šenov is getting nearer every day. We've also received applications from people from Ústí. Please pray for them so that the Lord may awaken them and open their eyes and hearts for the Gospel. Petr Staněk has handed in his application, too. He even came to our Bible study last week (for the first time since September). He said he wanted to start attending the church again, but he didn't make it on Sunday or for the Bible study on Tuesday.

We also pray for Petr Papež and his relationship with Valerie. They are planning their wedding. They are going to live in Poděbrady so they won't be a part of our fellowship.

However, the Lord is opening the hearts of people in Poděbrady and we pray that a new church could be started. Please pray for people there and for Petr's ministry to them.

Please pray for Petr's Mum who now attends regularly. We pray that the Lord would change her heart and life. It seems He's at work and that gives us hope she'll reach salvation.

We are also beginning to prepare our next conference which is scheduled for January 2011. We have changed the theme – it is now “What is an evangelical?” after the book of the same name by Dr. M. Lloyd-Jones. We actually want to publish a translation of this book for this occasion. We believe that both the conference and the book will have a positive impact on the church in our country.

We want to go on helping the congregation in Kladno by preaching God's Word, although it might become more difficult with Petr's leaving our congregation. However, we consider it a privilege that the Lord gave us and we want to use His gifts to His glory.

Once again, thank you for your prayers, all your support and fellowship.
